



“ANAMIKA”: NAMELESS ONES WHO MATTER



My dear Confreres, I just thought of this above title “ANAMIKA” (the one without name) in the context of the Solemnity of All Saints and that of the commemoration of our departed Confreres and Family Members. The saints of the Church whom we venerate and our dear departed ones whom we remember have lived a life rather unknown and unrecognized. They are people who decided to live obscure, someone who did not fall into the trap of self-glory and vain appreciation. In the midst of so many who would like to be projected as master builders and winners in every battle, are not the life of these ANAMIKAS something worth reflecting?

I believe that Jesus desires such a philosophy of life from his followers. When he selected a few fishermen as his disciples he would have taken note of some characteristic style of their job as very valuable. **One of them would be to live unknown.** A good fisherman knows that when he throws the hook or the net into the deep not even his shadow should fall on the water. When we read the words of Christ that *you are the salt of the earth* (Mt 5/13), it would mean that those who had the privilege to listen to the words of Christ should melt themselves down to self-abasement.

Jesus himself tried to live unknown. The New Testament has perhaps knowingly kept the 12th to the 30th year of his life unremarked. This space of his life has given birth to a lot of imaginations and stories thereafter. But one thing is sure: **That unknown time has shaped the rest of his life.** Yes, chiselling

the wood under someone else' guidance and later learning the art by himself, he reached the fullness of his youth-hood. There isn't anything worth reporting about it. This, in fact, is the story of everyone who engages themselves in small scale works. **They do not even have a name.** For example, what is the name of the boy who throws the News Paper at your door? His name is "News paper Boy." If he dies in an accident tomorrow, would you ever mind it? Why should you worry, you would anyway get the news paper! **But if you wish to partake in his destiny, remember, you should stand behind the curtain – ANAMIKA.**

Jesus kept up such a philosophy of 'solitude' in all his teaching. *Your right hand should not know what your left hand is doing* (Mt. 6/3); *they left their nets and followed him* (MK 1/18). There is a sense of self-emptying all around his teachings. He insists that even the virtue of *fasting* should be done in secret (Mt. 6/16). Yet, in another place he teaches that they should fast by putting oil on their head and washing their face (Mt. 6/17). Jesus' disciples are expected to be like slaves who wait for their master to come at any unexpected time (Mt 24/45-51). All these people keep themselves away from the public prominence. As it is said in the Acts of the Apostles – they would turn our empty world upside down.

In this context the **Apostle John** deserves our special attention. He is someone who decides to scrap his name away because he stood by Jesus. In this modern world where people scribble their names at the corner of even a newly drawn picture, John who had every possibility to write his name in the history decides to be ANAMIKA. Even justly where his name should have appeared, he writes about himself as **"the one whom Jesus loved."** Even among the list of the disciples, he does not mention about himself as 'Apostle'.

In any language the sweetest words are 'names'. Of course, when it is one's own name, it is all the more sweet. **When someone mispronounces our name, how offended we become! When someone does something spectacular, there emerges the exclamation – "you have held high the good name of the family!" When someone does something abominable, it is complemented with the negative expression – "you spoiled our family name!"** In such a delirious world to go, 'nameless' bears an unsuspecting spiritual tag.

There is a specific theological backing in the decision of John. There is the background of a culture that has decided not to name God. When Moses asks God: Who are you? God answers him I AM WHO I AM (Ex 3/14). God has the right to name the other. Even when God entrusted the human being the right to name the whole of creation (Gen 2/19-20), God kept it as his right to name the human being. This is made clear through the change of name of Abraham, Peter and so on. Therefore John is ready to wait until God gives him a name.

In addition, the attitude of John is also a sign of his humility. It's a philosophy that counts the other better than oneself. That's why we do not find in the Gospel of John the "words of Consecration", instead we find there the act of the "washing of feet" (Jn. 13). This is a new Eucharist. **Eucharist should become the act of a slave who does not have name or address.** Yes, it is the best way to become THE ONE

WHOM JESUS LOVED – ANAMIKA. What more value do I have than that? Here, THE BOOK (Bible) becomes my book. The one who leans on the breast of Jesus and the one who stands at the foot of the cross – **It is me – THE ONE WHOM JESUS LOVED – ANAMIKA**. One thing is clear: **What is more important than “who you are” is what you would like to communicate through your life!**

My dear Confreres, we need to take a cue out of this message of the life of Christ and his followers. Our “**I consciousness**” projects our subjective interests more often than the values of the Gospel. How nice it is to take a back seat and to remain focused on Christ. There are incidents of great saints who wrote wonderful books and never put their names on it. It was just because they did not want to be known. It is time that we take a back seat. One thing is certain: **The one who decides to remain obscure has greater share of godliness in all his/her actions. After all God is unseen!**

CONGREGATIONAL MATTERS

Reliving the General Chapter Experience

My dear Confreres, I would like to highlight before you the invitation of our Superior General to relive the spirit of the General Chapter 2019. It is all about our life-style as MSFS Priests. I earnestly request you to go through the call of the Superior General and take to heart its content. I put it here below in his own words:

- Seven months after the General Chapter 2019, I invite us all to relive the experience of the Chapter to commit ourselves to work with fidelity to the call of the Chapter. The entire Congregation has, by now, been oriented to the call of the General Chapter to wake up and live up to the basics of our MSFS way of life. What now remains is its spirit, directives, and reflections as reproduced in the Call of the General Chapter. What remains for us are the challenges to be accepted and the path to be walked.
- During the General Chapter, we seriously reflected upon a monitored follow up to the call of the Chapter. Our reflections convinced us that the General Chapter is and should continue to be a significant grace for the Congregation. The Chapter has reminded us to move forward in and through our community life, lived in a disciplined Physical Local Community, for our mission to become greater signs of communion. Each MSFS should explore deeply the richness of his call to be a Fransalian in his Local Community.
- The General Chapter also reminded us that the proper way of living religious life requires a disciplined community life. There must be norms, directives, and conditions for observing the discipline in the spirit of our evangelical counsels. As Pope Paul VI reminds us: *The principal task of the General Chapter is, as time goes on, to keep intact those norms of the Religious family, which were set up by its Founder and Lawgiver. Therefore, it is your responsibility to firmly shut the door against all those modes of conduct which gradually devitalize the strength of religious discipline, namely, practices which are dangerous to religious life, unnecessary dispensations, and privileges not properly approved. (Pope Paul VI, 23 May 1964).*

I request all of you to go through the latest circular of the Superior General and take to heart his message for all of us.

Year of the Associates of the Fransalians

My dear Confreres, we have already constituted units of Fransalian Associates in our Province. Some units are actively functioning with frequent gatherings. Specific formation of these associates and consequent study of the works of St Francis de Sales and his spirituality are though yet to be accomplished. It is encouraging to note the deep interest of our Associates to partner with us in our missionary and spiritual journey. On July 18, 2017, our Congregation has published the Guidelines for Fransalian Associates. These guidelines provide inputs on the Identity of a Fransalian Associate, Membership, Formation, Apostolic Commitment, and Organization and Administration of the units. Formation of the Associates with a program is important to prepare those who are called to make their formal consecration as Associates. Focusing on the formation program for the Associates, with the consent of the General Council our beloved Superior General has declared the year 2020 THE YEAR OF FRANSALIAN ASSOCIATES. *Beginning from January 24, 2020, through January 23, 2021, we will celebrate the gift of Fransalian Associates to us. During this year of Fransalian Associates, we will:*

- *Initiate formation program for the Associates in preparation for their consecration (those who aspire to consecrate themselves)*
- *Study St Francis de Sales and his spirituality for daily living*
- *Living our call to holiness with the help of the Spiritual Directory and spirituality of St Francis de Sales*

The animation of the formation of the Associates of the Fransalians will be undertaken by the Mission Forum under the animation of the Councillor in charge of Mission.
